Rules

- Entries from members and nonmembers are allowed.
- All exhibits including those in the children's classes must be genuinely produced by exhibitors.
- Each entry will cost 20p. Entries are limited to 3 per class.
- 4. All entries must be made on the entry form provided.
- 5. All entries must be in a clean condition before exhibiting.
- Entries will be accepted from Friday 6pm until 9pm. Further entries and staging will be open 8.30-10.30am Saturday, with staging continuing until 11.00am.

Show room to be clear by 11am.

- Due to time constraints all entries must be submitted at the same time. Additional entries are not permitted.
- The Society will not be held responsible for any loss or damage to property or persons.
- Any complaints regarding judging must be made in writing to a committee member before 3.30pm on the day.
- 10. Prizes to be awarded as follows:

1st £1.00 2nd 70p 3rd 50p

The Show Room must be clear by 11.00am for judging to begin promptly at 11.15am

Exhibits must remain staged until 4pm
All exhibits not for auction to be claimed by 4.25pm

The committee has the power to deal with anything not in the rules, and the judges' decisions are final.

- 1. 6 potatoes any variety
- 1 heaviest potato

- 3 turnips
 (foliage trimmed to 5 cm/2ins)
- 1 swede (foliage trimmed to 5cm/2ins)
- 6. 3 beetroots (foliage trimmed to 5cm/2ins)
- 7. 3 parsnips (foliage trimmed to 5cm/2ins)
- 3 carrots any variety (foliage trimmed to 7.5cm/3ins)
- 9. 3 onions, dressed
- 10. 3 onions, dressed (under 250g)
- 11. 1 largest onion (neck trimmed to 12.5 cm/5ins)
- 12. 6 shallots
- 13. 2 leeks
- 14. 3 bulbs garlic (not giant, foliage trimmed to 5cm/2ins)
- 15. 6 pods of peas (stalk attached)
- 16. 6 runner beans (stalk attached)
- 17. 1 longest runner bean (stalk attached)
- 18. 1 dish of cherry tomatoes (with calyx attached)

- 19. 6 tomatoes (with calyx attached)
- 1 heaviest tomato (with calyx attached)
- 21. 1 lettuce (roots trimmed to 5cms/2ins)
- 22. 1 sweet pepper any colour/variety
- 23. 5 hot or chilli peppers any colour/ variety
- 24. 1 marrow (any variety, length not exceeding 37.5cm/15ins)
- 25. 1 heaviest marrow
- 26. 3 courgettes
- 27. 1 pumpkin.
- 28. 1 heaviest pumpkin
- 29. 1 squash
- 30. 1 cucumber
- 31. 1 cabbage (roots trimmed to 5cm/2ins)
- 32. 1 cauliflower (roots trimmed to 5cm/2ins)
- 33. 1 bunch of Kale (8pieces stems trimmed to 25cm/10ins)
- 34. 1 cob of sweetcorn
- 35. Any vegetable not in schedule
- 36. Most unusually shaped vegetable



- 37. 1 dish of fruit one type any variety
- 38. 3 Apples
- 1 dish of mixed fruit 3-7 varieties arranged for effect, foliage garnish permitted
- 40. 3 sticks of Rhubarb (tops trimmed to 7.5 cm/3ins)



- 41. 1 vase of 3 stems of spray gladioli
- 42. 1 vase of 3 blooms of the same variety
- 43. 1 bowl or vase of sweet peas

Home-made Produce & Crafts

- 44. 1 jar chutney
- 45. 1 jar pickles
- 46. 1 jar jam
- 47. 1 jar jelly
- 49. Victoria sandwich cake 2 cakes sandwiched together with jam and dusted with icing sugar

- 50. 1 cake, any type.
- 51. 1 bottle wine using fresh produce (no kits)
- 52. 1 bottle fruit liqueur using fresh produce (no kits)

Arts Crafts & Photography

- Hand knitted, stitched or crocheted accessory or toy (not garment)
- 1 photograph any subject must be taken on site max size A4
- 55. Any handmade craft item





Free entry, age up to 12. • The child's age must be given. • Children may also enter any other class.

- 56. 1 drawing or painting
- 57. Veg monster / animal no artificial items to be used except wire, pins or sticks to fasten the parts together
- 58. Group entry from any local school or youth organization

Entries in this class must be genuinely produced by the child.

74. 1 vase of mixed flowering stems containing a total of between 5 and 10, stems of at least two different varieties.


No seed heads, berries or accessories, such as bows, will be allowed. No marks for the vase itself.

Tips for new competitors

Don't worry if you haven't planned ahead:

- It doesn't matter if you haven't grown especially for the show.
- Read the schedule carefully and find classes where you have plenty to choose from. If you have 30 of something you are more likely to find a matching set.

Picking and preparing

- Make sure you follow the instructions. If the schedule says "12 pods of peas" don't enter 11 or 13. You'll just get a disqualification sign saying "N.A.S." (Not as schedule). Similarly, if it says "under 250gms" that's what it means.
- When a class specifies more than one item to be shown, select items that are as similar to each other as you can.
- Don't worry if you don't think your entry is good enough. Everyone is thinking the same thing!



Entering

- Allow plenty of time to register. You don't have to display your produce until Saturday morning, but do try and enter early. If you can, enter on the Friday evening when it will be quieter.
- Once you have entered there will be no opportunity add extra entries.
- You'll be given an exhibitor number.
 This goes on each of your entries.

Staging

- Wash vegetables before arriving at the hut.
- Allow plenty of time, particularly if you might need help.
- Some paper plates, vases and sand are provided or bring your own.
